2. The function of the vocational training supervisor responsible for the implementation of the program is performed by a physician authorized by the manager.
3. Organizer of vocational training / Person authorized by vocational training organizer credits the internship by placing an appropriate entry **in the student's vocational training card.** The condition for crediting the vocational training is the achievement of the assumed learning outcomes by the student.

1	Supplementary information about the organization of the Children's Ward (Clinic) and organizational links of the Ward (Clinic) with outpatient healthcare.	
2	Assessment of the child's condition and their psychophysical development.	
3	Learning about baby care.	
4	Getting to know the principles of nutrition of a healthy and sick child.	
5	Mastering the skills of the physical examination of children.	
6	Familiarization with the principles of first aid.	
7	Deepening the skills of proper diagnosis and differentiating between basic disease entities with particular attention paid to emergencies.	
8	Learning the correct interpretation of laboratory, imaging and pathomorphological test results.	
9	Participation in doctor's visits and familiarization with the rules of keeping patient records.	
10	Evaluation of the degree of hydration of an infant with determination of indications for rehydration treatment (amount and composition of the infusion fluid).	
11	Assessment of acid-base balance in a sick child, especially an infant.	
12	Performing the following treatments under supervision: collecting gastric and duodenal content, gastric lavage, connection of a drip infusion and performing injections.	
13	Getting to know the sanitary and epidemiological regulations in the Infants and Children's Ward and methods of preventing nosocomial infections.	
14	Participation in multi-specialist consultations.
